Attracting Birds with Feeders



Hummingbirds

FEEDER TYPE

Hanging hummingbird flower feeder, 4 feet above the ground

FOOD MIXTURE

Dissolve 1 cup of white cane sugar into 3 cups of spring or tap water

Swap out food mixture every 4–5 days

MAINTENANCE

Clean once a month by soaking feeder in a solution of bleach and water (1 tbsp bleach per 1 quart of water) and rinse thoroughly

DURATION

Keep out year round



Blue Jays

FEEDER TYPE

Tube feeder

4 feet above the ground

FOOD MIXTURE

Peanuts

Add more when feeder is empty

MAINTENANCE

Clean when mold or debris is present by soaking in a solution of bleach and water (1 tbsp bleach per 1 quart of water) and rinse thuroughly

DURATION

Keep out year round



Northern Cardinal

FEEDER TYPE

Tray feeder

ray reeder

4 feet above the ground

FOOD MIXTURE

Black sunflower seeds

Add more when feeder is empty

MAINTENANCE

Clean when mold or debris is present by soaking in a solution of bleach and water (1 tbsp bleach per 1 quart of water) and rinse thuroughly

DURATION

Keep out year round
